HEARING SCRIPTURE IN A NEW KEY

For five decades, the Calgary Council of Christians and Jews has promoted bilateral and multilateral faith understanding, harmony and dialogue in Calgary, Alberta. The necessity of social distancing over the past year required that we use Zoom to maintain our connection with each other.

In this workshop, we wish to demonstrate the benefits of reading Scripture together with a book that is particularly suited for discussion: *The Bible with and without Jesus*, by Amy-Jill Levine and Marc Zvi Brettler.

This book casts light on biblical texts that are significant especially to Christians, but differently so, for Jews. The authors disclose the original meaning of each text and the history of its interpretation in Jewish and Christian traditions. The book gives Christians the means for exploring the Judaism of Jesus, Peter, Paul, John and James. At the same time, it equips Jews to appreciate how the New Testament reflects the contours of first century Judaism.

We have developed high levels of friendship and trust through our conversations. This book has taught us to listen to each other. We are able to speak honestly, to listen attentively and thus appreciate the rich diversity in our relationships with G-d and with one another.

In our workshop, we will offer the opportunity to experience shared scriptural study from a chapter of the book.
